**Attend** professors' office hours to become fluent with class material.

**Identify** points of access across UVA: Women's Center, LGBTQ Center, Multicultural Student Services, SFS, OAAA.

## CAPABILITY

**Invest** in yourself by building knowledge, skills, and brainpower; discovering new passions; and satisfying your curiosities.

**Develop** skills and personal characteristics such as leadership, teamwork, and oral and written communication skills; a global mindset; maturity; and self-awareness.

**Hone** in on a discipline and enhance coursework around it and experiences within it (minor, concentration, area of focus, undergraduate research).

**Study abroad** to develop cultural competencies and connect business themes around the world.

## CONNECTION

**Build relationships** by finding or becoming a peer mentor and getting to know a professor during office hours.

**Get involved** on Grounds and engage in opportunities outside of the classroom.

**Be a good neighbor** in your residence hall/apartment.
